Qualifications for OSHC services (SA)

Each state and territory has their own qualification requirements for working with school age children in out of school hours care services (OSHC). This guidance sets out the specific educator-to-child ratios and qualifications for OSHC services in South Australia (SA).

Ratios

- The minimum <u>educator-to-child ratio</u> for children **over** preschool age is 1 educator to 15 children.
- The minimum educator-to-child ratio for any preschool-age children is 1:11.
- Where an OSHC is caring for children of both preschool age and school age, a mixed ratio is applied. See the examples in the following pages for further information.

General qualification requirements

At least one educator (present at all times the service is operating) must hold an approved diploma qualification (or higher) as detailed below. This person, known as a *first educator*, must hold an approved qualification listed by the Australian Children's Education and Care Quality Authority (ACECQA) for SA.

<u>Where 30 or more children attend a service</u>, the *first educator* must hold an approved qualification as identified above. In addition, the service must have another educator, who holds at least an approved certificate III or IV in education, disability or care for every **1 educator to 30 children**. These educators, known as the *second and subsequent educators*, must hold a qualification from the <u>approved ACECQA list</u> for *second and subsequent educators* **OR** a higher qualification from the *first educator* list.

Any other educators required to meet ratio requirements do not need to hold a qualification.

First educator qualification

Qualifications listed for a first educator are diploma equivalent level or higher.

The list of qualifications includes any *completed* diploma-level qualification (or higher) from any accredited Australian higher education provider and/or registered training organisation from the following <u>broad disciplines</u>:

- Education, care, disability
- Behavioural and social sciences
- Community services
- Health
- Allied health
- Sport and recreation
- Creative arts.

To understand if a qualification is relevant as a first educator for OSHC consider:

- 1. Is it from an Australian University or registered training organisation?
- 2. Is it a diploma qualification or higher?
- 3. Does it fall under one of the six identified disciplines? (It might fall under two of these disciplines such as social science and community work)
- 4. Has it been *completed*? (It must be completed.)

OR

5. Successfully completed 2 years of a 4-year tertiary education degree from an Australian University. There is no need to be actively working towards completing the degree.



Non-Australian qualifications will continue to be assessed by ACECQA (a cost is involved).

All previously listed qualifications for SA continue to be recognised.

The qualifications specific to SA are listed on the <u>ACECQA website</u>.

Second and subsequent educator qualification

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Qualifications listed for a *second educator* are any certificate III or IV or equivalent in the <u>broad disciplines</u> of education, care or disability from any accredited Australian higher education provider and/or registered training organisation.

Fifty percent completion of a diploma in the broad education, care or disability will be recognised as equivalent to a certificate III level.

Educators must have evidence of successful completion of 50% (or equivalent) of diploma qualification.

(Please note second and subsequent educators may also be filled by someone with a first educator qualification.)

Examples of second educator qualifications

To understand if a qualification is relevant as a second or subsequent educator for OSHC consider:

- 1. Is it from an Australian University or <u>registered training organisation</u>?
- 2. Is it a *completed* certificate III or IV qualification?
- 3. Is it from one of the broad disciplines of education, care or disability?

OR

4. Has fifty percent of a diploma been completed <u>in one of the broad disciplines of</u> <u>education, care or disability</u>?






